HOW TO GET THERE...

You'll need a valid passport and a Soviet visa issued from either a Soviet Embassy or Consulate. You can contact the tour operator for information and reservations. In North America, call FINNAIR, (213) 216-5750, Mr. Narakka, and in Japan (Tokyo) call FINNAIR 222 6801 for your flight reservations to Finland and mention the LENINGRAD HAMVENTION 1990. Travel into Leningrad is by rail on luxurious Russian passenger cars complete with dining facilities.

WANT TO OPERATE FROM THE USSR ?

Through special arrangement with Inter-Radio in Leningrad, you can obtain an amateur operator's permit valid for the duration of your stay in the USSR. You must file an application along with two copies of your license and send to the Consulate of Finland, address below, for handling.

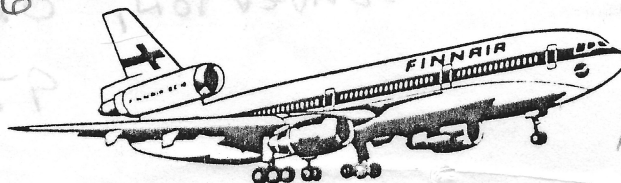

FINLAND - LENINGRAD



INTERNATIONAL HAMVENTION Leningrad-90

An international amateur radio event called "INTERNATIONAL HAMVENTION LENINGRAD 90" will be held in Leningrad between August 3-6, 1990. The program includes presentations by world's top DX and contest operators, talks on VHF and packet radio, a Russian-style social evening, sightseeing tours and a visit to a Summer Palace near Leningrad. Family members are remembered as well: during the ham radio event they will have an opportunity to go on sightseeing tour and see the city's museums and palaces.

WHY LENINGRAD?

Set in a beautiful environment with old monuments from the Czarist era, Leningrad makes an excellent venue for an international hamvention. St. Peter's Church, the Hermitage, hundreds of bridges and ancient fortifications represent some of Leningrad's unequalled cultural attractions. Several Summer Palaces around the city will show their best features particularly in August.

HOW TO JOIN THE FUN?

As co-organizer of the event, the Finnish Amateur Radio League will make it easy for you to attend the Leningrad Hamvention. Helsinki is noted for its hospitality in hosting greatpower leaders who stop over here before setting foot on Soviet soil. The best thing for you is to arrive in Helsinki on the evening of Wednesday, August 1. Our travel agent, FRIENDSHIP TOURS, will arrange a sightseeing tour of the Finnish capital on Thursday morning, and for the evening we have reserved a restaurant for a "pre-Russian dinner" with a DX-related "menu". The trip to Leningrad will be made by train which is scheduled to depart from the Helsinki Railway Station, right in downtown Helsinki, at 13:12 on Friday and arrive in Leningrad at 20:30 local time. If you wish, you may dine on the train, and snacks will be available in the evening.

~~Friday~~^{SATURDAY}'s program consists of the hamvention, with a hotel and its three auditoriums serving as the venue. In the meantime, family members may join a sightseeing tour. The evening will feature a Russian get-together at a nearby restaurant.

Sunday is set aside for visits to various attractions of the city: the Hermitage in the morning and a Summer Palace outside Leningrad in the afternoon. On Monday, you will board the train for a trip back to Helsinki where you are to arrive at 16:55 local time. For Tuesday night, we have arranged a "Survival Party" in Helsinki and the time to say good-bye will be on Wednesday, August 8.

Our travel agent offers you a possibility for an extended stay in the Soviet Union. You may stay over in Leningrad or choose one of two alternative tours: -Moscow-Kiev-Moscow/Leningrad... or -Kiev-Moscow... These trips will run until August 15. If you decide to spend any time in the Soviet Union after the hamvention, please mention this when booking your trip.

HOW TO PROCEED?

You may file your visa application with the Soviet Consulate in your own country. The Soviet travel agent is INTER and the number of the trip is 0308. In Helsinki, your contacts at Friendship Tours are Tarja Vaakanainen and Helena Johansson (address: Friendshipp Tours, Kaivokatu 10 D, SF-00100 Helsinki, Finland tel. +358-0-175 522). If you wish to operate /UA1 in Leningrad, you can do that. Please ask for an application for from the Finnish Amateur Radio League and mail two copies to the hamvention organizers in Leningrad. They will see to it that you get a license.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The trip form Helsinki to Leningrad and back costs FIM Y660. The price includes your train fare, hotel accomodation in Leningrad, meals on Saturday and Sunday, sightseeing tours and hamvention admission charge. In Finland, a visa application will cost FIM 35.-. If you decide to stay longer in Leningrad, you will be charged USD 60 a day. Trips to Moscow and Kiev will cost USD 840. You may choose your own accomodation and program in Helsinki. Please inquire about prices.
